EAMHID 2017 welcomes contributions from different research fields involved in ID and mental health, both from the academic/research and from the professional community.

## PROPOSAL FORMATS

The conference welcomes proposals for the following open formats:

### 1. Individual papers

Individual papers will be thematically clustered in oral paper symposia. Individual papers will be orally presented by one author and typically refer to research (e.g. basic and applied as well as use-inspired research, or new models, theoretical concepts and professional practices. The presentation time is limited to **15 minutes**.

### 2. Posters

Posters depict ongoing and recent research and practical projects and posters will be presented by the presenting authors during poster-sessions. Pin walls are available (100 cm width and 250 cm height)

## GUIDELINES FOR SUBMITTING A PROPOSAL

- Submissions for **individual papers and posters** are done by the first authors. Abstracts follow a structured format (Aims, Methods, Results, Conclusions).
- Proposals for **symposia** are submitted by the proposed chair, and include symposium title, name and affiliation of chair, background and aim of symposium, followed by structured abstracts of all authors with their names and affiliations.
- Abstracts for **co-productive workshops** are submitted by the proposed chair, and include a title, names and affiliations of participants, a brief description of the goals, followed by a description of the interactive formats used and the various perspectives (stakeholders) considered.

## IMPORTANT DATES

The deadline for abstracts will be **25<sup>th</sup> of March 2017**. All abstracts will be peer-reviewed and the acceptance feedback will be offered by **30<sup>th</sup> of April 2017**.

First authors have to register for the conference before **20<sup>th</sup> of May 2017** for their abstract to be included in the abstract volume (special volume of JMHRID).

### 3. Symposia

Symposia consist of 3 or 4 presentations around a common theme or topic. One of the presenters will act as chair, who will collect abstracts from the other presenters, and will submit these as one via the on-line submission tool. The symposium has an overall duration of **90 minutes**.

### 4. Co-productive workshops

Co-productive workshops are symposia, workshops, or round table meetings focusing on knowledge sharing, learning, idea generation, and agenda setting from multiple perspectives, including the perspective of people with intellectual disabilities and their carers. The chair of such workshops will submit the proposal on behalf of all the participants. A co-productive symposium has an overall duration of **90 minutes**.

Abstracts are submitted in English language through the congress' homepage.

Abstracts are limited to 250 words.

All the abstracts submitted will be reviewed and prioritised based on relevance to the conference theme, clarity of communication, methodological strength (in case of research), and involvement of stakeholders (co-productive workshops).
